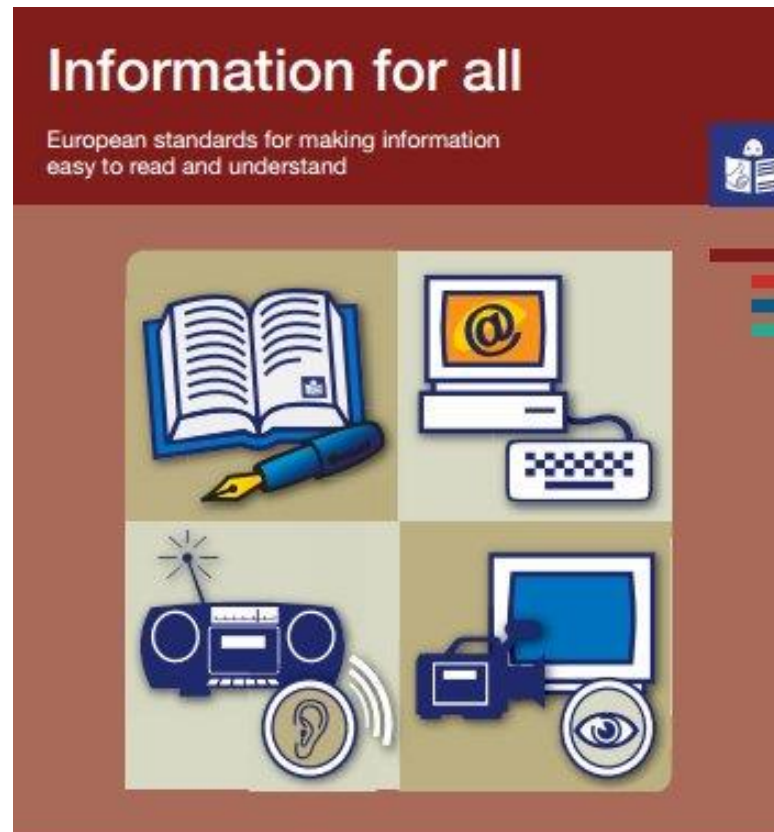
Discrimination of persons with ID
